EBSCOhost Class – For nursing, medical and general information

EBSCOhost offers the CINAHL (<u>C</u>umulative <u>I</u>ndex to <u>N</u>ursing and <u>A</u>llied <u>H</u>ealth <u>L</u>iterature) database and other nursing, health business, and consumer health databases. In addition, there are other databases with articles on various subjects, including many helpful to younger students.

Ovid Class – For medical and nursing information

Ovid provides access to MEDLINE and several Evidence Based Medicine databases. MEDLINE is a database offered by the <u>U.S. National Library of Medicine</u> that includes over 24 million citations for biomedical articles dating back to the 1940s (and even some back to the 1800s!) and also includes a subset of nursing journals.
