Attention to Maternal Health Gains Statewide Attention

Saint Peter's Continues Long History of Leading the Way

A regional leader in maternal health services, delivering thousands of babies every year, Saint Peter's **University Hospital** was New Jersey's first state-designated Regional Perinatal Center to provide exceptional highrisk maternity care for women and their newborns. With services that range from a midwifery service to an awardwinning Level III **Neonatal Intensive** Care Unit (NICU). Saint Peter's has set the standard for maternal and newborn care.

Saint Peter's University Hospital is the first and only New Jersey hospital in the Council of Women's and Infants' Specialty Hospitals (CWISH), a collaborative of 14 hospitals across the country that works to establish best practices for women's and infants' healthcare services. Widely recognized for its Level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) which has earned awards for its expert nursing care of premature or fragile newborns, mothers experiencing high-risk pregnancies often seek out Saint Peter's for its advanced diagnostic testing and high-risk pre- and postnatal care. With the birth of more than 5,400 babies last year, Saint Peter's continues to be one of the region's top hospital choices for families.

At a time when maternal death due to complications such as postpartum hemorrhage gains attention, Saint Peter's – as it has for many years – stores O-negative blood in its Labor and Delivery Unit. It is standard protocol in the event a mother may need a transfusion due to blood loss. At its two-year-old Simulation Center for Interprofessional Learning, hospital staff is trained to recognize and treat postpartum hemorrhage and reduce complications.

Saint Peter's is also the first in New Jersey to offer Enhanced Recovery After Surgery (ERAS), a specialized program for expectant women experiencing a Caesarean section. The nationally recognized program reduces the need for opioid pain medication while concurrently reducing the length of hospital stay and recovery time. Women can go home sooner yet are connected to the medical team via a mobile app.

Four years ago, The Children's Hospital at Saint Peter's University Hospital became the first regional hospital in the metropolitan area to fully equip its NICU with live-streaming cameras that make it possible for parents to view their babies from a secure, password-protected portal. Recognizing the importance of nurturing the special bond between a family and their infant, Saint Peter's equipped all 54 bassinets in its NICU with a NICVIEW camera. The project was made possible thanks to a generous donation by The Provident Bank Foundation.

This spring the NICU staff launched FaceTime Rounding, the first initiative of its kind in the state to deliver a live audio and visual feed to parents whose infants need specialized long-term care. With the rollout of this new program, parents remain connected to their babies and are able to contribute to real-time discussions and decision-making about their newborn's care while at work or home.

When the Mary V. O'Shea Birth Center is completed this summer, Saint Peter's University Hospital will mark another milestone in its premier role as a regional leader in the state for providing expert maternal health services. Located in the Women and Children's Pavilion, just a few floors down from the hospital's labor and delivery suites and NICU, the birth center will be the first one in the state to be housed on a hospital campus. Women will be able to choose personalized options for giving birth in a home-like environment, with the advantage that should an emergency arise, emergency care is immediately available.

The center is the next step in the evolution of comprehensive women's health services provided at Saint Peter's. Certified nurse midwives will practice at the new, state-of-the-art birth center, providing not just health care for pregnant women, but also wellness care for women of all ages. Saint Peter's introduced midwifery services in 2017 and today three certified midwives make up the team of providers.

In April, the hospital welcomed Carlos W. Benito, MD, (right), maternal fetal medicine specialist, as its new chair of the Department of Obstetrics/ Gynecology.

Dr. Benito is a member the New Jersey Maternal Mortality Review Committee and is committed to continuing his advocacy for advancing maternal health outcomes during his tenure and leadership at Saint Peter's.
