Preparing for Pregnancy? Saint Peter's is a Premier Hospital for Maternity Services

Saint Peter's University Hospital delivers more babies than any other facility in central New Jersey, making it the premier hospital in the state for maternity services. Last year, 5,200 mothers gave birth to 5,285 babies at Saint Peter's. Celebrated for its maternity services, Saint **Peter's University Hospital** has specialized programs and a knowledgeable staff of doctors, nurses, certified nurse-midwives and others who take pride in providing women with a comfortable and safe experience during pregnancy and delivery.

"We are always preparing for the pregnancy—prior to conception, during the pregnancy, at delivery and during the postpartum period to ensure that we provide the best care and achieve the best outcomes for our expectant mothers and their babies," said Carlos W. Benito, MD, chair of the Department of Obstetrics/ Gynecology (OB/GYN) at Saint Peter's. "We're proud to offer comprehensive women's health services from midwifery care for a low-risk birth to maternalfetal medicine care should the expectant mother be experiencing a high-risk birth."

Saint Peter's takes a familycentered approach to birth. Parent Education classes help the expectant parents prepare for childbirth - from Lamaze and Birth Center classes to New Daddy and Sibling classes. A designated admission area for expectant mothers is right outside the delivery rooms in the Women and Children's Pavilion so there is no delay in admission. The roomy private labor and delivery suites allow spouses and support persons to be present during labor. After delivery, the healthy baby stays with the mother in her room, allowing time for bonding, until both are ready to go home.

A State-Designated Regional Perinatal Center

The Regional Perinatal Center at Saint Peter's is well-known for the extraordinary level of care its board-certified physicians and specialized staff provide for women experiencing high-risk pregnancies and infants who were born prematurely or with serious medical issues.

Clinical aspects of the state-designated Regional Perinatal Center include the Antenatal Testing Unit and the Division of Maternal-Fetal Medicine at Saint Peter's, which provides the highest quality of care to pregnant women experiencing medical complications such as hypertension, high blood pressure, preeclampsia (toxemia), diabetes, thyroid disease and infectious diseases. Saint Peter's maternal-fetal medicine specialists treat women with conditions including multiple gestations (twins, triplets or more), recurrent pre-term labor and delivery, premature rupture of membranes, suspected fetal growth restriction and suspected abnormalities in the fetus.



Through an affiliation with Columbia University Medical Center, Saint Peter's is the only hospital in New Jersey to be part of the Maternal-Fetal Medicine Units Network, created by the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development. This network focuses on clinical questions in maternal-fetal medicine and obstetrics, particularly with respect to the continuing problem of preterm birth. Saint Peter's is also the only New Jersey hospital member of The Council of Women's and Infants' Specialty Hospitals (CWISH), which is dedicated to facilitating excellence in providing healthcare services to women and infants nationally through collaboration and support of programs, practices and national policy.

Award-Winning Neonatal Intensive Care Specialists Caring for Fragile Newborns

It can be a scary and unexpected experience to have a newborn in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) at The Children's Hospital at Saint Peter's University Hospital. The NICU, recognized among the nation's top 50 Best Children's Hospitals for Neonatology by *U.S. News & World Report* three years in a row, is staffed 24/7 by a board-certified neonatologist, nurse practitioners, a physician assistant, registered nurses, respiratory therapists, and a neonatal-trained pharmacist and social worker who make it their mission to address the needs of the babies in the NICU while also supporting their families.

Saint Peter's NICU is a three-time recipient of the Beacon Award for Excellence from The American Association of Critical-Care Nurses (AACN), having become the only NICU in New Jersey to receive its first Beacon Award in 2014. Saint Peter's also earned The Joint Commission's Gold Seal of Approval® for Perinatal Care – a symbol of quality that reflects the organization's commitment to providing safe and quality patient care for mothers and infants leading up to, during and after birth.

The NICU at Saint Peter's was one of the first hospitals in New Jersey to evaluate the use of surfactant therapy, which is now routinely used to treat breathing problems in premature babies. It was also the first hospital in the region to offer brain cooling, a treatment for newborns suffering with moderate or severe asphyxia.

The Mary V. O'Shea Birth Center

Saint Peter's Mary V. O'Shea Birth Center is New Jersey's first Birth Center to be located on the grounds of a hospital and the first and only hospital-owned birth center in the state to be accredited by the Commission for the Accreditation of Birth Centers.

At the Birth Center, the mother's birth plan is key to the birth experience. Developed at the beginning of the pregnancy, expectant mothers document their personal preferences and wishes for how labor should progress—everything from designating support individuals in attendance to labor expectations and preferences for medical intervention, should the need arise.

"This philosophy represents a holistic approach with consideration for a woman's desire to experience the birth of her child in a natural way that focuses on her engagement in the process and with less emphasis on the clinical aspect, yet the hospital's Labor and Delivery Unit is just an elevator ride away, if need be. For some women, the Birth Center is the inclusive, personalized one-on-one approach they've been searching for," said Pamela Harmon, MSN, RNC-NIC, nursing director, Women and Children's Division and administrative director of the Mary V. O'Shea Birth Center at Saint Peter's.

Staffed by Saint Peter's certified nurse-midwives, the Birth Center offers hotel-like suites and amenities and is equipped to offer a variety of nonpharmaceutical pain management options including hydrotherapy, aromatherapy, nerve stimulation, sterile water papules and different massage techniques. The average length of stay in the Birth Center, from the time the mother is admitted to the time she and her baby are discharged, is 8 to 12 hours.

Saint Peter's Now a Tier 1 Facility in Horizon's OMNIA[™] Health Plans

Saint Peter's Healthcare System and Horizon Blue Cross Blue Shield of New Jersey (Horizon BCBSNJ) announced that they have agreed to end their dispute over Horizon BCBSNJ's OMNIA™ Health Plans. Saint Peter's University Hospital received an "A" grade in the spring 2021 Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grade, a national distinction recognizing Saint Peter's achievements protecting patients from errors, injuries, accidents, and infections. The Leapfrog Group,

an independent national watchdog organization committed to health care quality and safety, assigns a letter grade to all participating general hospitals across the country and is updated every six months.
